We are in a rare situation as we transform our organization downstairs while our beloved legacy, former service monkeys, are enjoying their post-service years upstairs.

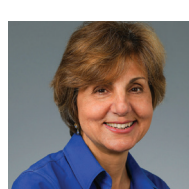

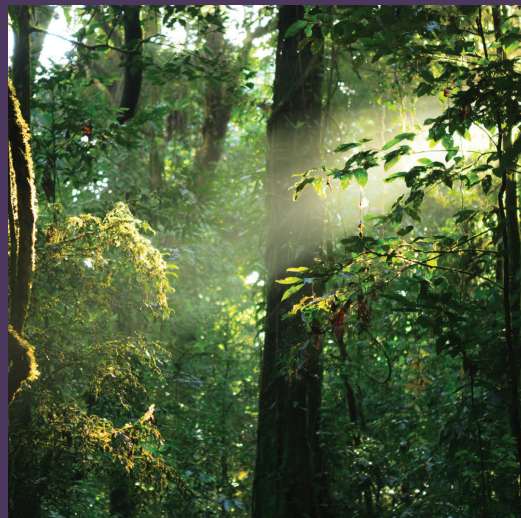


SAVE THE DATE!
