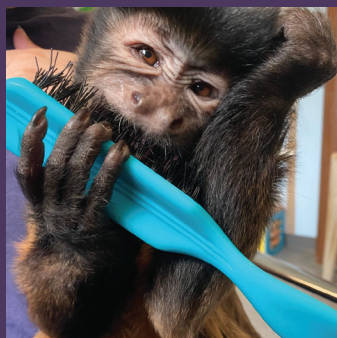

You can even make a gift in honor of your favorite monkey! (\$40 for 40 years, for example!)



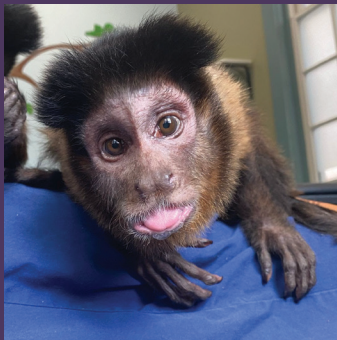

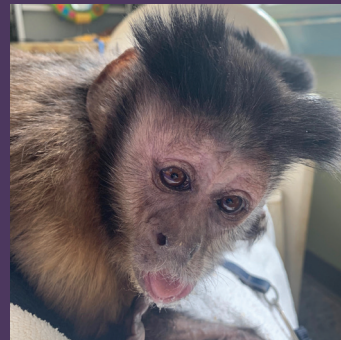
